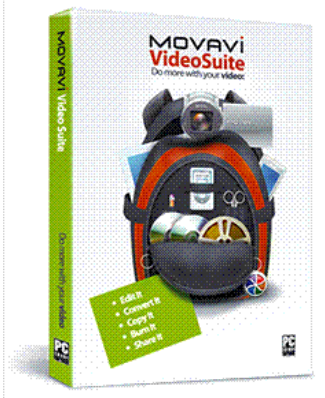

Rich's Ramblings:

Having a iPod video device is really exciting, especially when you find a great program like Movavi, Which is a movie editing/converter program. I have found very few things that it would not convert to play on my iPod. (outside of commercial purchased movies)

Have you ever wished you could capture just one part of a dvd that you thought was interesting or well worth watching again? Without having to mount the dvd and skip to the part that you wanted to view over and over again?

Well Movavi video is the tool. You can create a iPod video of just the best parts from regular (non commercial) dvd or videos that you have downloaded from the Internet. (almost all the formats are supported; .mpeg, mp4 .avi, wmv and others) You have the option of either creating a standard iPod viewable resolution or a higher resolution version that you can play on your iPod and view on a local Television set. If you have a video iPod and don't pick up the accessory cable that plugs into your iPod and the other end with the RCA connectors to connect to most modern day Televisions, you are missing alot.

I received the program for free but I would gladly pay the suggested retail of \$59.95 as it is so powerful. The capabilities cover most anything that you would want to do with video clips and movies.. This program is not limited to the video iPod as it covers much more, like PSP, PDA or cell phone.

Recommended System Requirements:

Microsoft Windows 2000/XP with all recent updates installed

Intel or AMD or compatible processors at 1.5 GHz or higher

Display graphics minimum resolution of 800x600x 32-bit color

RAM: Minimum 256 megabytes (MB) or higher

1 GB of free hard disk space for proper operation

Quick Time Player for Windows for MOV-files processing

Administrative permissions are required for installation

Sound card

As with all video manipulation programs, test them out before you buy. You can download the program and give it a try before you buy. Movavi allows a trial which allows you to use it four (4) times before it requires payment or removal. Also, Of course Movavi will not allow you to select parts of commercial DVD or copy protected/copyrighted movies and videos. I tested version 3.3 as of 11/21/2006. Movavi will convert the video iPod movies (MP4) back to AVI type files and then you can convert them to regular DVD movies so that you can play them on a regular TV-DVD player, or most anyway. I use Nero Ultra version 7 and it creates a DVD from .AVI, MPG and other formats so that it plays on most TV DVD players.
